WORKSHOP TITLE	Responding to adolescents' sexual & reproductive health needs
RATIONALE	Sexual and reproductive health is central to adolescent development. Adequate health care, prevention, sexual health promotion and education represent in all parts of the world a major challenge, both for health care providers and stakeholders in charge of designing preventive interventions and policies. A well-trained, cultural sensitive workforce, using a rights-based and developmental approach, is crucial to meet the SRH educational and service needs of adolescents.

Training objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Identify the role of sexuality within the adolescent developmental process and forming identity 2. Access relevant epidemiological data in order to understand SRH service and educational needs of adolescents. 3. Develop effective strategies to discuss and investigate SRH needs in an adolescent, taking into account cultural and personal values 4. Review relevant counselling approaches in the prescription and follow up of contraception 5. Review the management of adolescent unintended pregnancy, including abortion. 6. Review sexual rights and their impact on the provision of sexuality education and the management of sexual violence (incl. female genital mutilation) 7. Evaluate the effectiveness of various preventive approaches targeting the issue of STIs (incl. STIs) and pregnancy
