<b>WORKSHOP TITLE</b>	<b>Health screening of adolescents in a busy clinical setting</b>
<b>RATIONALE</b>	<p>The majority of adolescent morbidity and mortality is preventable and associated with behaviors such as substance use and abuse, unsafe sexual practices, road accident, and mental health issues.</p> <p>Current trends in adolescent morbidity and mortality have turned greater attention to the preventive role of the health care system.</p> <p>The majority of adolescents visit a health care provider once a year (often in emergency), providing an ideal opportunity to integrate prevention into clinical encounters.</p> <p>The workshop will provide pragmatic approaches and tools on how to screen and manage adolescents in a busy clinical setting</p>
